**Saint of the Month** - St. Luke's two-volume work comprises the third Gospel and the Acts of the Apostles. His Gospel is the only

one written by a Gentile Christian and it is likely that he wrote it between 70 and 85 AD. Luke's writing is warm and his Gospel is often summarised as the Gospel of Mercy. Luke was a disciple of Paul, first appearing in Acts during Paul's second missionary journey to Philippi. He was a faithful missionary companion of Paul and stayed nearby when Paul was imprisoned. Paul refers to Luke as "our beloved physician". St. Luke is the Patron Saint of Artists and Painters and of Physicians and Surgeons. His symbol is an ox. The feast of St. Luke is October 18<sup>th</sup>.

## St. Dyfrig's News

### Archdiocese Project – Staying Together While Apart

The Parish has received a grant from the Archdiocese to help keep in touch with our parishioners and the local community. We are using the money for envelopes, paper, stamps and address labels. We will post out our weekly newsletter to parishioners who do have access to the internet so are not able to read the newsletter. We have drawn up a list of names taken mostly from our census details but also have added names suggested by other parishioners. The project will start this week so hopefully those on the list will receive a newsletter. If you know of someone who you think would like to receive our weekly newsletter, please contact the names below. Also, if you have a newsletter posted to you but don't want to receive it, again contact the names below.

We will also be posting out a monthly newsletter to members of our local community who are on their own or are in an isolated situation. It will contain details of local support and information about various services available. Contact details: Sue Cleary – 07576 319082, Lesley Hughes – 07799 613527.

**The Hall Development Group** has been successful in securing a grant from the Welsh Assembly to repair the large front doors to the hall and also many of the windows either side and above the doors. We are also trying to secure another grant for the repair of the external render of the walls of the hall as well as repairing and replacing the small windows along the side of the hall. A contractor will be appointed as soon as RCT and the Archdiocese Faculty have given final approval as the building, like the church and the presbytery are Grade II listed and are subject to a number of restrictions and conditions on the work to be carried out.

Because the planning permission has been delayed, the main contractor, once appointed will not now start work for at least another two or three months but in the meantime, there will be preparatory work started on the internal walls of the foyer where the damaged lintel needs to be exposed.

The group are also hoping to meet with Neil Spiller, the Health and Safety officer as well as Suzy Stacey from All Hallows to look at protocols for opening up the hall again for events. With the current lockdown in RCT, it is unlikely that any events will be able to take place before Christmas. However the Group will endeavour to move things on to make the hall accessible again as soon as we can.

**Pontypridd Food Bank** has new premises – Ilan Community Centre Rhydyfelin. Donation can be made between Mondays and Fridays, 9 am to 11.15 am. They are short of the following tinned items: rice pudding, meat (not pork), fish; crisps, sweets and chocolates.

The well-known missionary/teacher/author, Frances Hogan has been studying St. John's Gospel and you can access free on You Tube (Frances Hogan/St. John's Gospel/Shalom World). The first study was the 19<sup>th</sup> January.
